

Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things will be added unto you. - Mt. 6:33



What does it really look like to seek the Kingdom of God first and foremost above all else? Jesus' famous command was given in contrast to worrying about and running after the things of this world. Even common things like food, shelter and clothing! But the reality is, a large part of our day is going to be dealing with the basic employment. Whether it be a job we punch in at, or the regular jobs of laundry and lawn care - there is just a lot in this world that will take up a large portion of our time. Jesus wasn't saying to ignore the regular demands of this life, but getting at our priorities and our passion. What is it that drives us?

His comment is really the same as the first and greatest commandment to:

Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. Mk 12:30

Are we seeking the Kingdom of God above all else? Are we striving every day to grow in righteousness? To put off sin, and to put on radical, alien, out-of-this-world love? Are we longing to spend time with Jesus? Does our heart delight in prayer? Worship? Do we go through our day with a simple trust and gratitude aimed personally at our Heavenly Father?

What are you pursuing? What is the next big thing? Paying down debt? Chasing a promotion or a different job? Do you pass your days counting down to your next big vacation? Saving up for a home renovation? These are all fine and good, but do they occupy more of our thoughts and energy than simply seeking Jesus?

Are we as zealous to grow in our understanding of the storyline of Scripture? Have we zeroed in on the next area of our lives that need to be submitted to Christ, the next sin to crucify, the next fruit of the Spirit we are longing to see manifest in our lives through God's grace?

Maybe just getting through it? At the end of the day, you just want to check out and plop down in front of the T.V., or internet, or Sudoku, or solitaire, or ...well, you tell me? What eats up your time until the next day when you do it all over again? Perhaps life has become a journey just to get back to bed. We've all been there. What is most dangerous during these times is they parallel spiritual idleness. Spiritual sloth. We're fine. We're doing the right stuff. We aren't doing the wrong stuff. But if Jesus were to ask us, are you seeking me first? Really seeking me? Are you laboring for my Kingdom? Are you battling sin? Waging the good fight? Are you loving me with all your energy and your entire mind?

Well, who of us could answer yes? That is why the faithful, long journey of faith is marked by continual honest assessment, focus, and re-focus, and daily repentance. And that is why we need one another. Always and often. We need to see each other seeking after Christ on the days when our love has grown cool. We need to confess our complacency, our compromise, our entanglement in the interests of this world. Our spiritual laziness. And we need to challenge one another to keep seeking. And seeking first. Seeking more and above all else.

Jesus made a radical demand, but he meant it by way of encouragement. All that is in this world, both that which we actively seek, and that which we passively slump into, is empty, vain, fleeting, and ready to be burned up. He reminded us that we needn't be wrapped up in the cares of this world, because our Father in Heaven cares for us. We must seek him, because he loves and sought us. What greater joy is there than to throw off every stressful entanglement, every dead-end pursuit, and to run the race marked out for us?

To pursue Jesus and his Kingdom is to pursue glory, joy, fulfillment, and rest. It is to pursue love, holiness, fellowship, compassion, humility, and self-sacrifice. It is to be like Moses and throw off the comfort and opportunities our birth in a land of prosperity can afford us to labor among the slaves of God. In that pursuit is found freedom. True and full freedom. *May God show us each what it is to seek him first in all things.*




The Potter's Kids
